

**A PROCLAMATION**

**WHEREAS**, latex allergy is an allergy to proteins in natural rubber latex which can be life-threatening; and

**WHEREAS**, latex allergy affects an estimated 18-73 percent of people with spina bifida, 38 percent of dental care workers, 34 percent of children who have undergone three or more surgical procedures, 10-21 percent of health care workers, 11 percent of rubber industry workers, 6.8 percent of people with allergic conditions and 6.4 percent of the general population; and

**WHEREAS**, the Allergy to Latex Education and Resource Team (A.L.E.R.T.), Inc. actively seeks to stop needless sensitization, creates safe and healthy environments, encourages health awareness and well-being, helps those with latex allergy escape the victim mentality and learn how to live and enjoy life; and

**WHEREAS**, our citizens should recognize natural rubber latex can cause potentially serious allergic reactions and medical problems; and

**WHEREAS**, there are only a few medical and dental facilities where a person with latex allergy can safely enter; and

**WHEREAS**, latex allergy causes job loss, quality of life reduction, negative lifestyle changes, isolation, escalating health care costs, and increased financial burden; and

**WHEREAS**, an increase in the awareness of latex allergy may stimulate the interest and concern of the American people, which could lead to increased research into the needs of individuals with latex allergy and prevention of latex allergy;

**NOW, THEREFORE, I, JIM DOYLE**, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, do hereby proclaim October 2-8, 2005 as

**LATEX ALLERGY AWARENESS WEEK**

in the State of Wisconsin, and I commend this observance to all citizens.
